CLEAN UP YOUR GARDEN AND
REMOVE ANY DEAD PLANTS



PLAN FOR SPRING AND START
ANY SEEDS INDOORS



DON'T CHURN YOUR SOIL AT
THE END OF THE SEASON



DON'T PULL OUT PLANTS THAT
MIGHT GROW AGAIN



DON'T FORGET TO DRAIN YOUR
HOSE AND DRIP SYSTEMS



DON'T PRUNE SOFT PLANTS
BEFORE COLD WEATHER



DON'T LET YOUR GARDEN DRY
OUT OVER WINTER

WINTER GARDENING DO'S AND DON'TS



Grow winter crops like kale, lettuce, and spinach.



Don't churn your garden at the end of the season.



Use covers to protect your plants from winter frost.



Don't pull out plants that might grow again.



Prune your trees and remove any dead branches.



Don't neglect your hose and drip systems.



Plan for spring and start any news seeds indoors.



Don't let your garden dry out over the winter.
